This year's PhD school of the IMISCOE network reflected upon how racism and race have been dealt with by migration studies, and race critical studies (notably postcolonial and decolonial studies, critical race theories, Black Studies, ...). There are many different epistemologies, conceptualizations and theorizations, which are not always obvious to people engaged in the field. From 24 to 28 April, and together with 25 PhD students from across the globe, we

explored the state of the art around the topic of migration, race & racism. We discussed different theoretical and methodological challenges including measuring manifestations of racism & discrimination, and reflected upon solutions. The week was filled with fruitful debates during many workshops, lectures, and visits!
